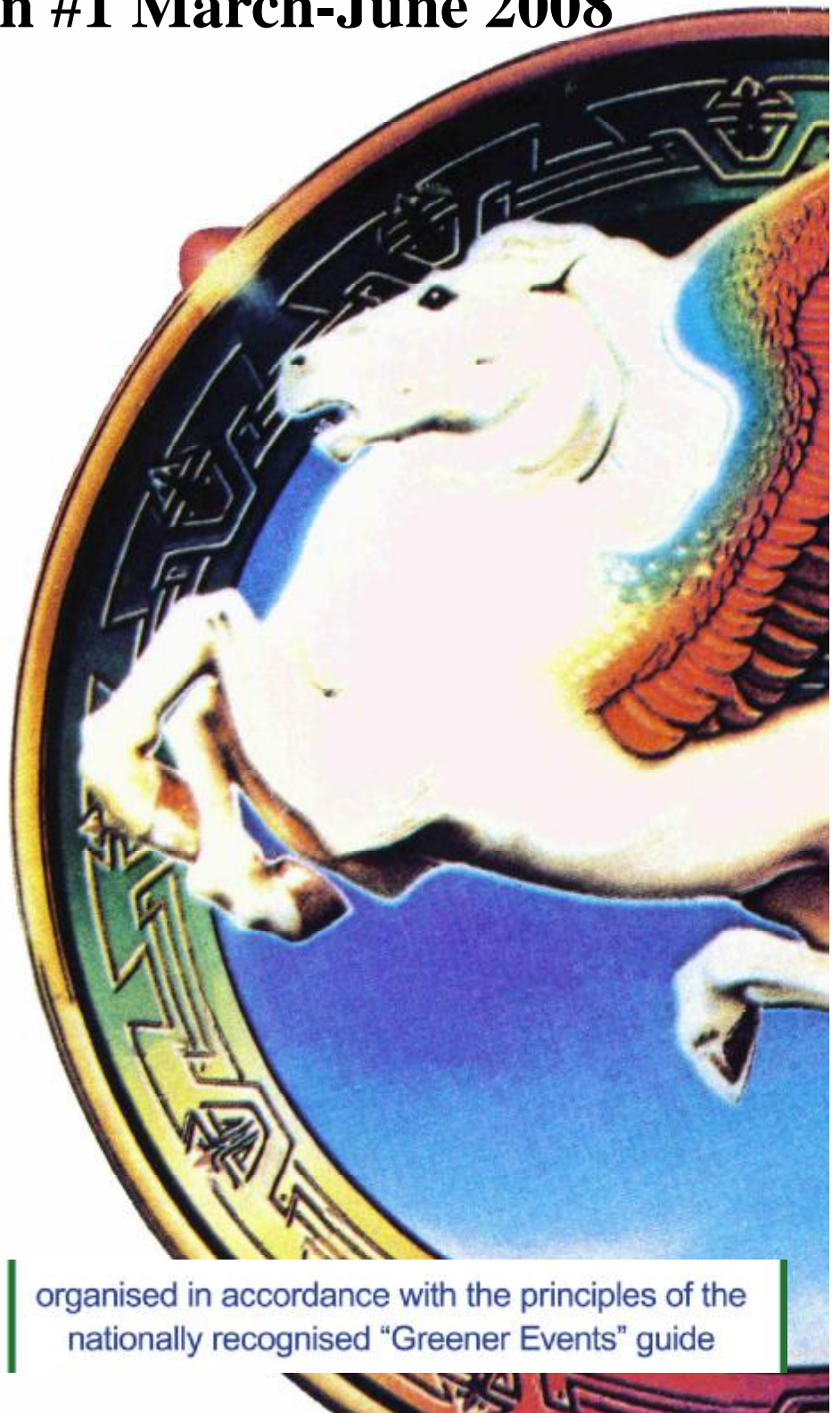

We are concerned about the local environment and about local activities which threaten the environment elsewhere in the world.


We will always aim to meet and where possible exceed the environmental standards set down by law.

We Will :-

- 1) Integrate the consideration of environmental concerns and impacts into all of our decision making and activities,
- 2) Promote environmental awareness amongst our employees and encourage everyone to work in an environmentally responsible manner.
- 3) Reduce waste through re-use and recycling and by purchasing recycled, recyclable or refurbished products and materiel's where these alternatives are available, economical and suitable, additionally whenever possible replace printed items with their electronic equivalents,

- 5) Purchase and use environmentally responsible products accordingly,

Environmental Action Plan # 1 (March 2008)

This is the first in a series of plans outlining our commitment to sustainability. This sets out what we intend to do and the processes we are looking into to achieve this. It is not a definitive statement and as best practices become clear, and technology changes the document will be updated to take these changes into account.

Due to the fact that there are currently no 'Green' funfair operators we are taking a leap into the unknown and there are no pre existing templates for us to follow that are specific to our industry. The numbers of the paragraphs relate to the matching sections of our environmental policy statement.

- 1) When planning the acquisition of new equipment, or the planning of new events, we will draw up a detailed document setting out the environmental impact of the various options available to us, wherever possible, the greenest option will take preference.
- 2) Details of the steps concerning recycling and re-use of resources will be circulated to our employees, furthermore they will be encouraged to follow the same procedures both at work and at home.
- 3) All of our office facilities will switch to using recycled paper, inks and other office consumables. If possible vegetable inks will be sourced and used. We are discussing with our corporate clients the possibility of supplying all safety documents in PDF format rather than on printed media to reduce paper usage.
We have ordered a number of recycling stations to enable us to separate and recycle waste rather than allowing it to degrade in landfill. Due to the fact that customers taking consumables off site will dispose of goods themselves we are replacing our consumables with biodegradable alternatives. We have just ordered our latest coffee cart cups in a biodegradable format, and intend that by the 3rd quarter of this year all of our consumables will be biodegradable. We are setting up a composting facility to dispose of our coffee grinds, tea bags and other organic food waste created at our events.
- 4) We are investigating the possibility of switching our generators and heavy transport to the use of biofuels, or a biofuel/fossil fuel blend. As a first step when our current agreement with our fuel card provider expires, we will switch to the Rix Petroleum Green card which promotes the use of B5 biofuel blend. Ultimately we would like to acquire the use of a mini Biofuel processing plant to process waste oil into biofuel for use in our operations. Additionally, we are replacing our large HGV mounted games units with small, traditional units that can be dismantled. As an example our shooting gallery is carried on a vehicle achieving 8 MPG. This same vehicle can carry upto 20 of our new games units. Alternatively a smaller number of units (upto 6) can be carried by van achieving 35 MPG.

One of the major uses of energy on the fairground is lighting. As lighting needs replacing we will use where possible energy efficient alternatives such as LED or fluorescent lighting. Where this is not possible, we will use lower wattage lights, we have already replaced the majority of our 500 watt halogen bulbs with either 300 or 150 watt versions.

4) Continued

The motor systems on our children's rides are being replaced with energy efficient inverter drives, replacing the old fashioned dc drives that utilise resistance controls to vary the motor speed, these same controls generate large amounts of heat, all wasted energy that is eliminated with our new drives.

- 5) Many cleaning products can now be replaced with environmentally friendly alternatives, this will be done where possible.
- 6) We already have spill response kits in our vehicles for use with hydrocarbon oil spills which is the only hazardous substance we use. The clean up fluid we use was recently replaced with a completely non toxic biodegradable product.
- 7) We will be issuing press releases and also promoting our moves towards sustainability using our web sites, Internet media and other communications resources.
- 8) This action plan will be re examined, updated and compared to our actual progress at quarterly intervals.
- 9) We will initially offer help and advice to other operators that are subcontracted to our events, eventually it is envisaged that priority will be given to 'Greener' operators.

Micro Recycling Bin

One of our micro recycling bins designed for use with our Victorian Candy Floss Carts. The bin has 3 separate sections designed for collecting waste candy floss bags (plastic), candy floss sticks (wood) and popcorn bags (paper).

These are collected after the events and saved at our Yorkshire depot until we have sufficient quantities to be collected by the recycling firms we are using.



Jora JK Organic Waste Digester



A Swedish designed system that is designed to accept organic food waste and other biodegradable products. This will be used to dispose of any food waste collected at our events as well as the biodegradable catering consumables and any other substances that we find it is capable of digesting.

The system uses a mix of food waste, sawdust (to provide carbon energy) and microbes which use carbon energy to help digest the waste and turn it into compost. The compost will then be given to any local gardeners who require it free of charge.
